REPORT OF THE INDIAN PHYTOPATHOLOGICAL SOCIETY FOR THE YEAR 1981, PRESENTED AT THE 34TH GENERAL BODY MEETING HELD AT NEW DELHI ON DECEMBER 19, 1981

Mr. President, Fellow Members of the Society, Ladies and Gentlemen;

It is indeed a great pleasure to welcome a galaxy of Indian and foreign scientists at the 34th Annual General Body Meeting of our Society in continuation of 3rd International Symposium of Plant Pathology at New Delhi.

I am sorry to inform that six of our renowned Mycologists and Plant Pathologists Drs. K. M. Smith (Honorary Fellow), M. K. Hingorani, D. S. Bhander, D. G. Gundu Rao, K. S. Bedi and R. G. Anderson left for their heavenly abode. We express our heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families and pray to God that their souls may rest in peace. On behalf or our Society I request you all to kindly stand for two minutes in silence to pay our homage to the departed souls.

It is indeed heartening to note that the numerical strength of our Society has increased by 212 members. Thus a total number of members as on November 24, 1981 stands 1235 excluding subscribers 400. During this year 142 have not paid their dues so far and it is my earnest request to them to kindly oblige us by clearing the dues as soon as possible.

You will be happy to note that the financial position of our Society continues to be fairly sound. The Society maintains saving bank accounts with Grindlays Bank Ltd., Syndicate Bank and Bank of India and the credit in saving accounts with these banks and cash in hand is Rs. 1,30,665.20 paise. In addition a sum of Rs. 60,000/- is in fixed deposit with Messers Grindlays Bank Ltd. for five years, due in 1982. A sum of Rs. 11,000/- received for M. J. Narasimhan Academic Award Contest has been put in fixed deposit in Syndicate Bank for 63 months, due in 1984. Thus the total assets amount to Rs. 2,01,665.20 paise. Some of the cheques are still in the process of collection. During the year, the receipts amount to Rs. 2,04,244.63 paise and expenditure amount to Rs. 1,77,099.29. Thus leaving a balance of Rs. 27,143.34 paise. We have paid the cost of printing of our journal, the Indian Phytopathology Vol. 33 (Nos. 2-4) of 1980 and Vol. 34 (Nos. 1-3) of 1981. We are grateful to Indian Council of Agricultural Research for their financial assistance of Rs. 10.000/- which they have given us for printing the journal. We are grateful to Drs. M. R. Siddiqui, R. P. Singh and D. K. Agarwal for doing the Internal Auditing of the accounts for 1980 and 1981 and they are further requested to help in the next year. The printing of the journal is in the hands of Messers Kapoor Art Press, New Delhi.

I am extremely happy to inform you that our journal is now upto date. I sincerely congratulate the Chief Editor Dr. H. K. Saksena and Editor Dr. J. P. Verma and also all the valuable referees, members of the Society and Editorial Board members for their excellent cooperation in bringing the journal upto date. Please give a hand to them.

This contest carries an award of Rs. 1000/- and a citation, has been held since 1972 to encourage young scientists. This year we have received seven papers for the competition.

Plant Disease Problem :

A few more copies worth Rs. 181.50 were sold. This brings the total amount collected by way of the sale proceeds of the volume to Rs. 21,346.30 paise out of Rs. 25,000/- invested by the Society.
